A proud and beautiful but poor and pressed people living literally off the land with almost no resources, education, or security.



But what can't you see?

The plague of Oriental Fruit Fly (*Bactrocera dorsalis*) and Mango Fruit Fly (*Ceratitis cosyra*) that have made this place their home and destroy half of the mango yield.

And now the **huge idea**... which is the Biofeed *Crop^Shield* pest control method - a method that is hugely effective in ridding growers like these of the scourge of fruit flies. Watch as the Biofeed *Crop^Shield* units are <u>deployed on the trees</u>, it is a sight to behold. The barefoot kids have to climb up over seven meters so the camels don't chew on the Biofeed units. The way they go at it, it looks like hanging the units is the most fun they've had all month. They don't realize that it's probably the most profitable thing they'll do **all year**. The high winds and coming rains may make this seem like an impossible pest control environment. In terms of the working environment, the chances of effective pest

control are tiny - but our ability to be successful even in an environment like this is what makes Biofeed so huge.
